Lessons Learned

- After a suspected COVID-19 encounter, ensure a thorough decon is completed on scene and upon returning to the station.
- Anticipate having to back out of a call to ensure the proper PPE is donned. As information comes into ECDC and relayed to companies, crews may already be engaged with patient care.
- All crew members should check each other before engaging in the incident.
- Do NOT allow your “comfort level” to let you make decisions. Be guided by Department guidelines, policies, and procedures. Personal beliefs should NOT influence your decision when deciding which City or Department policy to follow. As a supervisor, your choices have a far-reaching impact on the health and safety of your crew and the public we serve.
- When working with a crew that you are not familiar with, always state your expectations early and establish a game plan for addressing COVID related incidents (i.e., roles of crew members).
- With varying levels of experience in the workforce and interactions with different agencies, continue to taking opportunities on calls to educate each other on best practices, guidelines, or protocols.
- Anticipated treatment should warrant the appropriate level of PPE (i.e., aerosolized generating procedures).
- If PPE needs to be donned after patient engagement, when appropriate, rotate crew members out. If there is going to be a prolonged exposure (i.e., crew member riding to the hospital), ensure the proper PPE is worn.
- Do not solely rely on the MDC when completing your scene survey (i.e., identifying COVID addresses).

 - If needed, slow down the tempo of your call (i.e., back out and don the appropriate PPE).

Personal Protective Equipment Guideline:

- Surgical mask, gloves and goggles/shield required on all calls
 - Scout always wears ALL PPE until COVID determined
 - Surgical masks on all EMS patients as tolerated
 - If COVID-19 is suspected, upgrade to N95 and gown

Supplies:

- Gibeck Humid Vent filter no longer for use with nebulizer
 - Can still use with BVM without nebulizer procedure
 - See attached for pictures and clarification
 - Bact-Trap filters still approved for nebulizer use
- Keep Pro-Tek RTU bottle if empty, can refill bottle at 42A
- Plastic face shields available at 42A, 2 per ambulance to be distributed and shared, now available for all units

N95/N100 FFR Collection for Reuse:

- Write your name on front, bottom of FFR before use. This is to ensure you get your mask back after decontamination
- Reuse FFR as normal, per current practice
 - After high-risk procedure place mask in bag
- When bag is full, drop off at 42A, and get a new bag and clip

General:

- Twice daily on-duty temperature checks are mandatory, link is on the left bar and also on your iPad
- Definition of COVID-19 exposure changed, now includes:
 - Any PPE breach, or missing any PPE on COVID pt
 - Any aerosolizing procedure, even with proper PPE
 - Extensive body contact with patient
- StreetEMS now requires PPE level to be documented for all providers, drop-downs are located in the "3 dots" button
- Nothing may be attached or tied to gurney hooks, handle
 - This is a safety hazard, may cause gurney to not secure properly and potentially prevent the magnetic safety from working to disable to raise/lower when secured to the hooks and handle

- Reuse FFR as normal, per current practice

- After high-risk procedure place mask in bag

- When bag is full, drop off at 42A, and get a new bag and clip

- If symptomatic, please call off to a supervisor, we do not wish to infect patients, co-workers or their families

- *updated* COVID-19 symptoms per CDC: Cough or SOB, OR 2+ of fever, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste/smell

Supplies:

- PPE kits no longer being made, pieces still available in bin 8
- Small gloves have new packaging, all sizes will change soon
- Keep Pro-Tek RTU bottle if empty, can refill bottle at 42A
- Plastic face shields available at 42A, 2 per ambulance to be distributed and shared, not issued to individual employees

Personal Protective Equipment Guideline:

- Facial coverings are to be used for duration of your shift
- Surgical mask, gloves and goggles/shield required on all calls
 - Choice of using either goggles or plastic facial shield is up to each individual provider
 - Surgical masks on all EMS patients as tolerated
 - Upgrade to N95 and gown if COVID suspected

N95/N100 FFR Collection for Reuse:

- Write your name on front bottom of FFR before use. This is to ensure you get your mask back after decontamination
- Reuse FFR as normal, per current practice
 - After high-risk procedure, instead of discarding mask, place FFR mask in sandwich size bag, then large bag
- When bag is full, drop off at 42A, and get a new bag and clip
- Keep bag in outside compartment with trauma bag

General:

- Remember to do your twice daily on-duty temperature checks, link is on your iPad and checks are mandatory

- Select DMV Offices have been reopened

- Normal St, San Marcos and Commercial Offices
- Expired/Expiring licenses still valid through 6/30
- Please ensure you maintain a valid license

- Definition of COVID-19 exposure changed, now includes:

- Any PPE breach, or missing any PPE on COVID pt
- Any aerosolizing procedure, even with proper PPE
- Extensive body contact with patient
